
The latest China lunar landing was Chang'e-5. It was launched in China, Hainan Island. The date it was launched was November 23, 2020. The date it landed on the Moon was December 1, 2020. The location of the landing was in the northwest region of the Moon's nearside called Mons Rümker. Its mission was to collect samples of rocks and dust to return to Earth. It collected 1.7 kg of rocks and dust, which is the weight of a 3-month-old kitten!!!!!!







Chang'e-6 is going to launch around May 2024. It was a backup for Chang'e-5 if it crashed on the moon. It is going to land in the northern hemisphere on the far side of the moon. It will be the first-ever soil and rock samples 2 meters below the surface from the northern hemisphere on the far side of the moon. It will get 2kg of rock and soil from the moon (that is the weight of a Chihuahua) and then return to Earth for further study. The landing site is called Apollo Basin inside the SPA Basin. The mission is predicted to last for 53 days.





According to the Chinese folktales, Chang'e flew from the Earth to the moon like a rocket ship. That's why China named its rockets after the moon goddess Chang'e.



Here are a few reasons why China loves going into space.

Firstly, there is scientific exploration. China thinks the moon is like a laboratory because there are a lot of things to study on the moon: rocks, dust, craters, ancient lava, and inactive volcanoes.

Secondly, China has technological advancement. It proves that China is skilled at building any type of thing. It also serves as a place to test new technologies to make sure it works and does not explode. It also proves China's space capabilities, like landing rockets softly on the moon, so it's not hard to get out and in from the rocket ship.

Thirdly, China has national pride and soft power. China seeks itself to be a national player in space exploration, along with the U.S. and Russia. China also shows things they collected on the moon and then sometimes brings them to the global stage. That's when countries around the world come together, compete, and demonstrate their capabilities.

Big Buddha:


